

Mother's Day May 10th





We receive reimbursement monies from the Area Agency on Aging in Coeur d'Alene which receives funding from the Idaho Commission on Aging which is funded from the U.S. Government Older Americans Act. This funding covers approximately 1/3 of the costs of our meals programs and limited scholarships for DayBreak participants. It does not provide funding for operating funds. SASi currently is providing approximately 2,100 meals a month, both in-house and through home-delivered meals to the entire Bonner County; respite services for seven families in the DayBreak Center and is a center for social, health and educational classes and events monthly. Stop by to learn more!

\$8.00 pays for a meal and \$10.00 pays for an hour of care at DayBreak. Unless specified, donations are split equally for operating expenses, the food program and the DayBreak Center. Please join us in thanking the above donors who give monthly, yearly and spontaneously to help us keep our doors open!!
