Changes to VA Healthcare Services in Sandpoint

The Department of Veterans Affairs has begun notifying nearly 2,000 veterans in the area that a planned health care group change is coming in the spring.

Currently the veterans are being served through the VA-contracted Kaniksu Health Care clinic in Sandpoint. KCHS has been a valued partner with Mann-Grandstaff VAMC by providing a contract clinic for Sandpoint-area Veteran's seeking the VA's high-quality care and access to a local clinic since April 2010.

As of March 31, 2022, the VA's contract with Kaniksu Community Health Services expired. To further help with the transition to a new clinic, KCHS will continue to provide services to Veteran's through June 30, 2022. The Mann-Grandstaff VAMC team will continue to collaborate with KCHS to ensure conintuity of care and services for Veteran's enrolled at the VA's contracted Sandpoint VA clinic.

Meanwhile, the VA has contracted with a new health care group called STG International, Inc. to take over care of veterans in Bonner County starting on July 1, 2022. A new location, possibly by the Litehouse offices on McGhee Rd, will be announced shortly.

VA officials said they do not anticipate any breaks in care for veterans being served in this region.

Disability housing grants for Veterans

The VA offer housing grants for Veterans and service members with certain service -connected disabilities so they can buy or change a home to meet their needs and live more independently. You may be able to get an Specially Adapted Housing (SAH) grant if you're using the grant money to buy, build, or change your permanent home (a home you plan to live in for a long time) and you meet both of these requirements.

Both of these must be true:

- You own or will own the home, and
- You have a qualifying service-connected disability

Qualifying service-connected disabilities include:

- The loss or loss of use of more than one limb
- The loss or loss of use of a lower leg along with the residuals (lasting effects) of an organic (natural) disease or injury
- Blindness in both eyes (with 20/200 visual acuity or less)
- Certain severe burns
- The loss, or loss of use, of one lower extremity (foot or leg) after September 11, 2001, which makes it so you can't balance or walk without the help of braces, crutches, canes, or a wheelchair

If you qualify for an SAH grant, you can get up to \$101,754 for FY 2022. This is the current total maximum amount allowed for SAH grants. Only 120 Veterans and service members each fiscal year (FY) can qualify for a grant based on the loss of one extremity after September 11, 2001, as set by Congress.

You can apply online right now by going to our eBenefits website.

You'll need to sign in to eBenefits with your DS Logon basic or premium account. If you don't have a DS Logon account, you can register for one on the site.

NATIONAL GREAT OUTDOORS MONTH





What is Juneteenth?

Juneteenth (short for "June Nineteenth") marks the day when federal troops arrived in Galveston, Texas in 1865 to take control of the state and ensure that all enslaved people be freed. The troops' arrival came a full two and a half years after the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation. Juneteenth honors the end to slavery in the United States and is considered the longest-running African American holiday. On June 17, 2021, it officially became a federal holiday.

Confederate General Robert E. Lee had surrendered at Appomattox Court House two months earlier in Virginia, but slavery had remained relatively unaffected in Texas — until U.S. General Gordon Granger stood on Texas soil and read General Orders No. 3: "The people of Texas are informed that, in accordance with a proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free."

The Emancipation Proclamation

The Emancipation Proclamation issued by President Abraham Lincoln on January 1, 1863, had established that all enslaved people in Confederate states in rebellion against the Union "shall be then, thenceforward, and forever free."

But in reality, the Emancipation Proclamation didn't instantly free any enslaved people. The proclamation only applied to places under Confederate control and not to slave-holding border states or rebel areas already under Union control. However, as Northern troops advanced into the Confederate South, many enslaved people fled behind Union lines.

Juneteenth and Slavery in Texas

In Texas, slavery had continued as the state experienced no large-scale fighting or significant presence of Union troops. Many enslavers from outside the Lone Star State had moved there, as they viewed it as a safe haven for slavery.

After the war came to a close in the spring of 1865, General Granger's arrival in Galveston that June signaled freedom for Texas's 250,000 enslaved people. Although emancipation didn't happen overnight for everyone—in some cases, enslavers withheld the information until after harvest season—celebrations broke out among newly freed Black people, and Juneteenth was born. That December, slavery in America was formally abolished with the adoption of the 13th Amendment.

The year following 1865, freedmen in Texas organized the first of what became the annual celebration of "Jubilee Day" on June 19. In the ensuing decades, Juneteenth commemorations featured music, barbecues, prayer services and other activities, and as Black people migrated from Texas to other parts of the country the Juneteenth tradition spread.

In 1979, Texas became the first state to make Juneteenth an official holiday; several others followed suit over the years. In June 2021, Congress passed a resolution establishing Juneteenth as a national holiday; President Biden signed it into law on June 17, 2021.


