Social Isolation – The importance of providing adult daycare and activities for all seniors

My grandson Michael is currently enrolled as a freshman at UCLA and recently emailed me a copy of a paper he had written about the effect of isolation among elders. I thought that it was well written and focused attention on the isolation many seniors feel.

"Over the last century, social isolation has become an increasingly central topic in regard to personal well-being and everyday health and awareness of the issue is at an all time high. Nevertheless, social isolation among older adults is seldom the center of the discourse, despite a shockingly high prevalence. Social isolation is the root cause of several conditions such as depression and dementia, making them nearly impossible to treat medically. The Older Americans Act of 1965, a landmark legislation providing funding and support for social service, has addressed this issue of social isolation through the support of adult daycare centers. These centers provide the necessary social immersion and support for conditions while reducing the stress and burden on family caretakers.

Events such as retirement, children leaving the house and the death of a spouse can leave older adults increasingly alone. This isolation is often a dramatic change of routine and those affected often describe bouts of sadness, boredom and loneliness (Valdez, Lumadue, Gutierrez, & de Vries-Kell, 2006). This lack of relations is known as social isolation and can have serious health consequences.

Experiencing social isolation is a known risk factor for depression, dementia, falls and even mortality (Nicholson, 2012). While the pandemic brought much-needed attention to the issue of social isolation, more needs to be done such as providing daycare/senior centers. Older adults with dementia have been shown to exhibit more positive behaviors and fewer restless behaviors after adult daycare (Woodhead, Zarit, Braungart, Rovine, & Femia, 2005). In addition, studies have shown that caregivers of dementia patients experience lower rates of depression when those they care for attend such centers (Zarit, Stephens, Townsend, & Greene, 1998)."

This doesn't apply only to those who need care and their caregivers, I feel it applies to all of us Seniors as we age. We are finding more and more people coming to the Sandpoint Senior Center to engage with others. They come to share a meal, play a game, get some exercise, take a class, or just to interact with others.

There is so much that the Senior Center can offer and with your help, we will continue to grow and provide even more services to the Seniors of Bonner County. As we age depression can happen from isolation. Let's commit in the New Year to reach out and encourage our friends to consider visiting the Senior Center and finding out what we have to offer.
