# My Mom is a Super Senior!

My mom, Rhoda Sanford, is a super senior. She continues to cut firewood with her new Ryobi battery operated chainsaw, stack wood, garden, and enjoy life, in spite of a few rounds of breast cancer and a gnarly gallbladder that resulted in open stomach surgery, a row of staples, and for a short time, a loss of taste and a bile bag. My mom claims that she will keep on keeping on until she can't, and then, she'll walk into the woods during the winter months and not come back.

Of course, I'm not ready for that to happen, but neither is she. When she first discovered that she had breast cancer, she researched her treatment options and worked with her physician and surgeon to come up with a treatment plan.

She asked plenty of questions, and together, her and her team fought the cancer and won-two times.

My mom has learned how to use the Internet, and when her gallbladder began troubling her, she searched for information about diet, exercise, and treatment. For a short time, her food intake was severely limited, because her body couldn't properly digest fat. Although she still can't pour heavy cream on top of her home made peach pie, she can ingest limited amounts of fat now, and her diet is almost completely normal.

My mom doesn't use a wheelbarrow when she relocates wood to the woodpile because she claims carrying a couple of sticks at a time forces her to walk approximately 1 mile a day. Walking, my mom claims, is great exercise, because it promotes a healthy heart while warding off depression. She also gathers information on nutrition, and cooks her meals with produce from the garden or health food store because she claims you are what you eat.

I am delighted that my mom has taken a proactive stance in her health, conducting research, exercising daily, and eating nutritiously. On the upper edge of 70, closely approaching 80, my mom continues to have a sharp mind, a keen wit, and a healthy body.
