Senior Spotlight: Ron May

This month, we are featuring a newcomer to SASi, Ron May. Ron was born on December 25, 1934 outside of Ellensburg, WA. Ron's father was a pastor, so the family moved every few years. They lived in Big Sandy, Montana for a few years, but always came back to Sandpoint. In early 1954, his parents and several siblings moved to Oregon. Ron stayed in Sandpoint, and on June 14, he married Loretta Woodfill.

During those first few years, he worked for a gas station and clothing store. After that, Ron worked for 14 years at Sandpoint Motors.

During that time their two sons were born. After working 3 years for the Bonner County Daily Bee, Ron started a landfill in Colburn and became Chairman of Colburn Water

Association in 1973.

In 1986 the county bought the remaining 36 acres of the landfill. He started a gravel pit which they operated until selling in 2002 in the hopes of retiring. Ron and Loretta bought a used 36' motor home when they headed out for the "warm South".

After 4 years of being snowbirds, and with the advancing of Loretta's dementia, they sold their RV and moved into an apartment in Sandpoint.

Ron decided after being an Elder at First Christian Church for 17 years, he resigned in order to take full time care of Loretta. On June 3, 2014, Ron made the decision to put Loretta into Valley Vista Care Center



Ron started coming to SASi last September for lunch. He's usually here Monday-Friday enjoying the meals and seeing old friends.

Mary's Munchie: Sugar-Crusted Almond Pastries

2 (8-oz) cans Pillsbury Refrigerated Crescent Dinner Rolls

1/2 cup butter

2 cups slivered almonds

- 1 1/3 cups sugar
- 1. Heat oven to 375*F. Unroll dough into 2 large rectangles. Place in ungreased 15x10x1-inch baking pan; press over bottom to form crust. Seal perforations.
- 2. Melt butter in medium saucepan over low heat. Cook and stir 4 to 5 minutes or until light brown. Add almonds and sugar; stir to coat. Spoon and

- spread mixture evenly over dough.
- 3. Bake at 375*F. for 11 to 16 minutes or until crust is deep golden brown. Cool for 30 minutes. Cut into squares. Serve warm or cool.

Winter Safety Tips for Seniors

Winter has arrived, bringing an assortment of hazardous conditions that can have negative impacts on your health. For instance, approximately 1.6 million seniors end up in the ER every year due to spills taken in slippery and icy conditions. Fortunately, you can decrease the chances of winter mishaps by taking a few simple precautions.

- 1. Stretch to improve circulation and loosen up muscles before you go outside.
- 2. Wear shoes with low heels, good support, and soles with plenty of traction.

- 3. Use handrails, walking sticks, canes or other supportive devices to help maintain balance and stability.
- 4. Exercise indoors. Take a dancing class at the senior center or try a yoga class in the community.
- 5. Stay warm inside by keeping your house at 68 degrees or above.
- 6. Keep your core temperature up by wearing loose-fitting clothing in layers.
- 7. Wear gloves, mittens, and a hat when you go outside.
- 8. Eat healthy and nutritionally. Calories provide heat. The senior center has lunches for seniors.
- 9. Drink plenty of liquids and eat foods high in water content, such as soups and vegetables.

- 11. Create a buddy system to ensure a communications system is in place in case of emergencies, such as power outages.
- 12. Winter storms often result in power outages. Be prepared by having batteries, flashlights, candles, Sterno fuel, extra blankets, and a battery-operated radio close at hand.

Winter does not mean an end to activities. However, taking precautions ensures that you can continue with regular scheduled activities throughout the winter months without mishaps that could result in a visit to the emergency room.
