Mary's Munchies: Green Velvet Cake for St. Patrick's Day

- 1 1/2 cups oil
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 teaspoon green food coloring
- 1 tablespoon vinegar
- 1 cup buttermilk
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 1/2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt

- 1. Combine eggs, sugar, oil & vinegar in bowl.
- 2. Mix well.
- 3. Sift flour, baking soda & salt together.
- 4. Add to egg mixture alternately with buttermilk, mixing well after each addition.
- 5. Blend in vanilla and food coloring.
- 6. Pour into 3 greased & floured 8" cake pans.
- 7. Bake at 350° for 25 minutes.
- 8. Cool.
- 9. Frost between layers, top & side of cake.

Prostate Problems

For men, prostate problems are especially frightening, as the prostate is the gland that makes sex possible. And men don't like to have that gland messed with. Speaking from the female side of the equation, I would much rather have my partner healthy, and urinating properly, even if that means removing the prostate. For me, a loving and healthy relationship is more important than sex

As men age, their prostate, an organ located beneath the bladder

that produces semen, can become problematic. The risk of prostate cancer among men in the United States, increases with age. In addition, the prostate can swell, which can strangle the urethra, making it difficult, or impossible, to urinate properly. If you are a male and experiencing painful urination, or issues urinating, you might have prostate problems.

Fortunately, prostate difficulties can be dealt with successfully. A prostate biopsy, a cancer screening that takes about 45 minutes, will help determine if you have prostate cancer. In many cases, prostate cancer is a slow cancer, and can be treated with hormone therapy, surgery, radiation, and/or chemotherapy. Numerous medications can be prescribed that help shrink an

enlarged prostate, and if herbal supplements are not sufficient, laser surgery, usually an outpatient procedure, will reduce the size of the prostate so that the flow of urine can return to normal.

Every man's system is unique, but in general, eating nutritiously, avoiding junk food and tobacco, not drinking too much alcohol, and exercising daily are the best medicine. If prostate issues rear their ugly head, remember that the woman in your life will continue to love you, even if you have to have your prostate removed.


