DayBreak Center: Silver Linings and Fun

Often when I tell people that I work at DayBreak Center, an adult day care program for people with memory impairments, they will get a sad look on their face and say something like, "Oh that must be hard!" And the thing is, it's anything but. We have so much fun here and those of us who work here agree that this is one of the best jobs we have ever had. We laugh and play games, have conversations and tell jokes, eat cookies and grapes and generally just live in the moment. How can that be?

The ability many of the participants here have to live in the moment, not worrying about the past, not thinking or being concerned about the future is a very stress free place to be. And people with memory issues can help us remember to take time to just be *here*, in *this* moment. And that one moment can so often simply be fun.

On the Alzheimer's Association website, I saw an article about a small study which noted that people with early dementia or mild cognitive impairment

scored high on the "Silver Linings Questionnaire" on areas such as: appreciation and acceptance of life, less concern about failure, selfreflection, tolerance of others and courage to face problems in life, stronger relationships, and new opportunities to meet people. Don't we wish we all could score high in those areas! The study suggests that the positive changes in attitudes after diagnosis are as common as the negative ones. At Day-Break, we always try to look for the positive spin the Silver Lining in all our interactions.

Mary's Munchies: Zucchini Bread

3 eggs

1 cup of oil

2 cups sugar

2 cups grated zucchini (leave skin on)

1 tablespoon cinnamon

2 cups flour

1/4 teaspoon baking powder

2 teaspoons baking soda

1 tablespoon vanilla

Optional – 1 cup chopped nuts or raisins, or both. Beat eggs till fluffy. Add oil, sugar and zucchini. Beat

well. Sift dry ingredients together; add to egg mixture.

Mix well; add vanilla, nuts and raisins. Bake at 350° in a greased and floured pan for 1 hour. Serve with soft cream cheese spread. Makes 2 loaves.
