Tops for me is this job I have at DayBreak Center where I am surrounded by so many intelligent, fun-loving, compassionate people: the participants who keep me smiling with their wit and swell my heart as I watch them watch out for each other; Adrianne, our activity assistant, who has my back and more energy on any given day than I can summon in a week; the SASi administration staff and board who give me guidance and support as I continue to learn the layers of this job. We have wonderful substitute activity assistants who cheerfully step in when needed and we have the most stellar, dedicated, loving volunteers any organization could want. When I started working here, this was the group I learned the most from in so many large and small ways — and still do.

This job also makes my brain work, and as the daughter of a mother who had early onset Alzheimer's disease, working my brain is important to me. On the alz.org website I saw a new study out indicating that working in a complex job that requires you to engage with people, instead of just data and things, might help in building resilience to Alzheimer's disease. Resilience is a quality that may explain why many people who are believed to be at higher risk for the disease, or even have brain changes, never develop cognitive dysfunction. So it isn't just using your brain, it's the social interaction that may truly be important. That's part of what you all do for me —- that and the friendship. I am so thankful for all of you. Mary's Munchies: Paradise Pumpkin Pie

8 oz. pkg. cream cheese

1/4 cup sugar

1/2 teaspoon vanilla

1 egg

9" unbaked pie crust

1 1/4 cups canned pumpkin

1/2 cup sugar

1 teaspoon cinnamon

1/4 teaspoon ginger

1/4 teaspoon nutmeg

Dash of salt

1 cup evaporated milk

2 eggs

Nuts (optional) Maple syrup & nuts for topping

Heat oven to 350°F. Combine cream cheese, sugar and vanilla. Mix well. Add egg; blend and spread over bottom of pastry shell. Combine remaining ingredients: mix well. Carefully pour over cream cheese mixture. Bake one hour and 5 minutes, or until done. Cool: brush with maple syrup, garnish with nuts. Serves 8.


