It's an "isolation buster"!

So thank YOU, the participants, who give SASi meaning! And thank you to the hard working staff and board for keeping it going!

When you think about making your next meal, think about cooking for a couple hundred instead! SASi's kitchen staff prepare an average of 2000 meals a month! About half are served in house and half go out with the Home Delivered Meals (HDM) program. That's a busy kitchen!

Lynn was born in Long Beach, CA and raised in Grants Pass, Oregon. She's been in Sandpoint for 21 years. At 51 years "young," she's the elder "young-in" in the kitchen and does the shopping for food that isn't ordered from Sysco.



Lynn has been with us seven years with a memorable start date of 9/9/09! She loves helping with the HDM program, filling in as a driver occasionally. Her loves are being a mom to her 15 year old son and gardening and tending her chickens.

Mary's Munchies: Quick Apple Cranberry Pear Muffins

1 pkg. Pillsbury Apple Cinnamon Quick Bread Mix 3/4 c. buttermilk*

3 tbs oil

1 egg

1 c. fresh or frozen cranberries, thawed

3/4 c. coarsely chopped walnuts

1 large firm pear, peeled, cut into 1/2 inch pieces

*To substitute for buttermilk, use 2 teaspoons vinegar or lemon juice plus milk to make 3/4 cup.

Heat oven to 400° F. Line with paper baking cups or grease cups in 18 muffin tin. In large bowl, combine

quick bread mix, buttermilk, oil and egg. Stir 50 to

75 strokes with spoon until mix is moistened. Stir in cranberries, walnuts and pear. Spoon batter into paper-lined muffin cups. (Cups will be full.)

Bake at 400° F. for 18 to 25 minutes or until golden brown. Serve warm or cool.

Makes 18 muffins.

The car flipped over ejecting my husband (and 15 years later, my son) through the windshield; they died; the world didn't collapse but our dream did; I did. A smoldering rage darkened my heart; it felt like I had donned a lead suit; it hurt to breath and tears stained my cheek, creating crevices and lines that sunk deep, a veritable grand canyon in the making. My hands felt like they were encircled in chains. And one day, I got up for work, but realized the only thing I had put on were my shoes,

so I took them off and went back to bed.

Beginning a new dream takes time, and love, and plenty of laughter. Moving to Idaho, the beginning of a new adventure, was a positive, yet difficult change, a letting go of the old dream, and the hope of creating a new one. It had its costs as well, and re-establishing any strain of sanity after falling so low was like learning how to dance an intricate tango. At first, I crawled, and my tentative first steps, usually ending in another fall, as I struggled with anger at god, at my husband for drinking and dying, at being a single mother, clawed chunks out of my very center.

Time does heal, and today a gray line of snow falls in gentle hallelujahs. My spirit sings that we are etched from our past—that we learn from our mistakes and as long as we pick ourselves up we can begin again. Today, the librarian calls me the happy hatter, and today, today, I seek to rise above and meet that gentle spirit with the loud laugh. She loves to play the banjo and is learning the fiddle. When I let her take charge, my laugh, too, resounds, in glorious hallelujahs. She says today is just another dream.
