

and bridal shower and these events have also helped me acclimate to the idea of my daughter moving on in life! I suppose these are not new ideas, but they were new to me!


So, now I'm ecstatic! My future son-in-law is a wonderful human being and they are so great together! I can't wait! I'll have lots of pictures to share afterwards!



1/2 cup (1 stick) butter

2 (1-ounce) squares unsweetened chocolate

1 cup sugar

2 eggs

1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/4 cup all-purpose flour

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 cup chopped walnuts (optional)

1. Preheat oven to 325° F. Butter and flour an 8-inch

2. Place butter and chocolate in a saucepan. Heat over low heat until chocolate melts. Remove from heat. Stir

in sugar, eggs and vanilla. Beat well. Stir in flour and salt. Stir in walnuts, if using.

3. Scrape into prepared pan and bake about 40 minutes. Let cool and cut into 2-inch squares. Serves 16.

Sandpoint Area Seniors, Inc. (SASi) is funded primarily through grants and *your donations*! We receive reimbursement monies from the Area Agency on Aging in Coeur d'Alene which receives funding from the Idaho Commission on Aging which is funded from the U.S. Government Older Americans Act. This funding covers approximately 1/3 of the costs of our meals programs and limited scholarships for DayBreak participants. It does not provide funding for operating funds. SASi currently is providing approximately 2,100 meals a month, both in-house and through home-delivered meals to the entire Bonner County; respite services for six families in the DayBreak Center and is a center for social, health and educational classes and events monthly.
