My mother developed what is now called early onset Alzheimer's Disease in her middle 50's. I watched my father care for her for many, many years. I was young, raising children, lived a couple hours away and, though we did visit often, I didn't really understand until much later in the game what he went through on a daily basis. Loneliness, depression, isolation, loss of enthusiasm and energy. 24/7 caregiving is not a walk in the park! The Alzheimer's Association has a brochure called "10 Ways to Help a Family Living With Alzheimer's." Number one on the list is "Stay in touch – show you care. A card, a call or a visit all mean a lot."

I remember my dad telling me that when people from some churches would knock on the door he would invite them in, not to find out about their religion, which he wasn't interested in, but to have someone to talk to. Sometimes just a short, normal conversation can give a bigger lift to a family caregiver's day than most people realize.

I wish now I had thought to call

my dad every day for a few minutes. And that I had encouraged my brothers, who lived farther away, to call weekly. I wish we had pushed him to get caregivers earlier than he did and more often. To spend the money for it because it was important. And I really wish there had been a DayBreak Center around when he needed it. I think he would have felt good about leaving my mom there and I know she would have loved it. She needed the socializing, and also the break from "that man" who was always telling her what to do!

## Mary's Munchies: Honey Pumpkin Dessert Squares

**Crust:** 1 C flour  
1 C quick cooking oats  
1/2 cup butter, softened  
1/4 cup packed brown sugar

**Filling:** 2 cans (15oz each) pumpkin  
4 eggs  
1 cup half-and-half  
1 cup honey  
3/4 cup packed brown sugar  
2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1/2 teaspoon salt

**Garnish:** 1/2 cup whipping cream  
1 tablespoon powdered sugar  
15 candy pumpkins

1. Heat oven to 350° F. In medium bowl, mix all crust ingredients with fork until crumbly. Press in bottom of ungreased 13x9 - inch pan. Bake 10 mins.
2. Meanwhile, in large bowl, beat all filling ingredients with wire whisk or electric mixer on medium speed until blended. Pour over partially baked crust.
3. Bake 55 or 60 minutes or until set and knife inserted in center comes out clean. Cool completely, about 40 minutes.

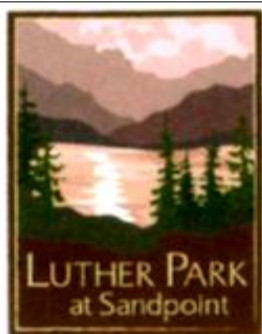

Sandpoint Area Seniors, Inc. (SASi) is funded primarily through grants and *your donations!* We receive reimbursement monies from the Area Agency on Aging in Coeur d'Alene which receives funding from the Idaho Commission on Aging which is funded from the U.S. Government Older Americans Act. This funding covers approximately 1/3 of the costs of our meals programs and limited scholarships for DayBreak participants. It does not provide funding for operating funds. SASi currently is providing approximately 2,100 meals a month, both in-house and through home-delivered meals to the entire Bonner County; respite services for seven families in the DayBreak Center and is a center for social, health and educational classes and events monthly. Stop by to learn more!

\$7.50 pays for a meal and \$10.00 pays for an hour of care at DayBreak. Unless specified, donations are split equally for operating expenses, the food program and the DayBreak Center.
