December and the holidays can bring such lovely things – Christmas carols, lights, trees, cookies, spiced cider, the beauty of falling snow and the indigo night sky with stars blazing. Some of us will have quiet holidays, and some will have lively times with visiting family and friends. Either way this month can be such a blessing of connecting with those around us in a joyful way.

For someone with memory problems this can also be a confusing time. Forgotten faces with names that won't come to mind. Groups of people talking together while they sit on the sidelines wondering what is going on. And why no one is talking to them. We tend to talk to those who understand us and can join in the conversation. Many people with some type of memory impairment still want to feel included but no longer have the ability to interact in a normal conversation or activity. How can we include them?

One of the simplest ways is to make eye contact with them as you are talking to others. Think how you might feel if you were

standing with three people who are talking together but none of them makes eye contact with you as they converse. Now would it feel different if whoever is talking looked also at you now and then, though the conversation is not something to which you can add anything? Simple eye contact, sitting beside someone even as you talk to others, along with a gentle touch or holding their hand, asking a simple question, all help to make someone with memory impairment, or someone who is new or quiet or shy feel included. And nothing beats a bit of quiet one on one time.

Another way to help a memory impaired person when there is a gathering is to have name tags with large lettering. Make it a fun thing that little Johnny needs to learn his uncles' names or something. I have learned the value of this at Day-Break. When participants see our name tags and each other's, I notice that they perk up a bit, use the names, interact more, and you can tell it makes them feel good. Give it a try and see what happens.

From all of us at DayBreak Center we wish you a beautiful December and a joyful, loving holiday season!

Mary's Munchies: "Night Before Christmas" Mice Cookies

3/4 cup butter or margarine, softened 1/2 cup smooth peanut butter 1 cup firmly packed brown sugar 1 egg 1 tsp. vanilla extract 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour 1/3 cup peanuts Red shoestring licorice Black coarse decorating sugar

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. In a large bowl, cream butter, peanut butter, and brown sugar until fluffy. Add egg and vanilla; beat until smooth. Add flour to creamed mixture; stir until a soft dough forms.

Shape dough into 3-inch balls. Pinch each ball to form a nose. Decorate each cookie using peanut halves for ears, small pieces of licorice for eyes, and a sugar crystal for nose. Use a toothpick to poke a hole in back of cookie for tail. Transfer to an ungreased baking sheet. Bake 10 to 12 minutes or until bottoms are lightly browned.

Transfer cookies to a wire rack. While cookies are

warm, insert 2-inch long pieces of licorice into holes for tails. Cool completely. Store in an air-tight container. Makes 4 dozen. ENJOY!!


I first want to wish all of you very Happy Holidays and a Happy New Year! I also wish for you good health and prosperity. As the new board president of SASi, I hope you will

Sandpoint Area Seniors, Inc. (SASi) is funded primarily through grants and your donations! We receive reimbursement monies from the Area Agency on Aging in Coeur d'Alene which receives funding from the Idaho Commission on Aging which is funded from the U.S. Government Older Americans Act. This funding covers approximately 1/3 of the costs of our meals programs and limited scholarships for DayBreak participants. It does not provide funding for operating funds. SASi currently is providing approximately 2,100 meals a month, both in-house and through home-delivered meals to the entire Bonner County; respite services for seven families in the DayBreak Center
