February brings not only more light but the first of five Papa Murphy's Fundraisers scheduled this year for our DayBreak Center Family Assistance Fund. This happens on Wednesday, Feb. 7th.

Some generous donations and a wonderful grant from the Alzheimer's Foundation of America to help DayBreak families with the cost of our program have helped to build our fund lately. Yet there is constant need to keep money coming in to the Family Assistance Fund because we are constantly taking money out of the fund every month to help those families. Many cannot afford the full cost to get the respite time the families really need. For example, if a participant in our program comes 3 days a week for 5 hours a day, a family can receive a monthly bill of around \$600! You can help these caregiving families by buying a pizza at Papa Murphy's in Ponderay on February 7th!






