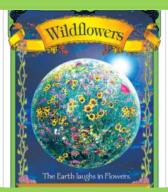

As Spring once again arrives on the Equinox, Tuesday, March 20th, we will be mailing out the packets of wildflower seeds as a way of saying thank you to our current donors and to ask for your continuing support in our annual "Sowing Seeds for Seniors" Fundraiser.

In its first year, SASi raised over \$10,000, with the proceeds going to the Food programs, DayBreak Center, vital activities, and other expenses. We hope we can double that amount this year!

Our Meals Program prepares and serves approximately 2000 meals a month "in-house" and "out." Each day, volunteer drivers come to the Center, pick up the hot food, and deliver it to a participant who cannot get out to go food shopping. We also have our Congregate meal served Monday through Thursday, at 11:30 am. On Fridays, we serve breakfast at 8:30 am.

SASi applies for and receives grant money and of course many generous donations from the community. We are so grateful to

all of you who give monthly, yearly, and of course during our fundraisers. Our need is greater than our resources. This fundraiser allows you to remain in the comfort of your easy chair or watch a game or have a day on the slopes. All that is asked is to take a few minutes to donate.

Each of us knows someone who is a senior. Some of us know or have a loved one that uses the Center or possibly receives a meal delivered to them. You may even want to come and make use of the Center someday.

With the new season of Spring, plant this packet of seeds as a reminder of your donation and what your gift to SASi will reap!

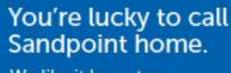

Betty attended the local schools, and after high school, she met her husband of 63 years, Keith. They lived in the Samuels area along with their 3 sons, and 1 daughter. During these years working for Dr. Bird, Betty did important work building 750 respirators, 1500 breathing circuits that were used in the Desert Storm war in the early 1990s. Betty also cooked at the hospital and for 7 years made disposable medical electrodes. Betty also made iewelry for Coldwater Creek. Betty says, "I was always working and liked doing the different things I have done over the years."

Mary's Munchies: Best Banana Cream Pie Recipe

Prep Time: 10 minutes Cook Time: 30 minutes Total Time: 40 minutes

3/4 c. white sugar

1/3 c. flour or 3 TBS cornstarch

1/4 tsp. salt

2 cups whole milk

3 egg yolks - beat

2 tsp. vanilla

1 pre-baked pie crust or graham cracker crust

4 sliced bananas 2 TBS butter

In a saucepan combine flour, sugar and salt. Add milk and cook over med. heat, stirring constantly until bubbly. Cook 2 more minutes, then remove from the heat. In another bowl, beat the 3 egg yolks, then stir a bit of the hot milk mix into the egg, stir well. Pour the eggs into the saucepan and mix in. Cook 2 more min. stir-

ring! Remove from the heat, add butter and vanilla. Slice the bananas and put them into the cooked crust. Bake at 350°F for 12 min. Remove and chill for 1 hr. Serve with whip cream and enjoy!

To make it green for St. Patrick's Day, add some green food coloring.

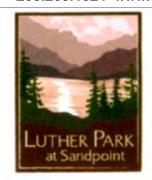

SASi is a non-profit organization. Your donations are tax deductible! We appreciate all of your contributions, any size!

Sandpoint Area Seniors, Inc. (SASi) is funded primarily through grants and *your donations*! We receive reimbursement monies from the Area Agency on Aging in Coeur d'Alene which receives funding from the Idaho Commission on Aging which is funded from the U.S. Government Older Americans Act. This funding covers approximately 1/3 of the costs of our meals programs and limited scholarships for DayBreak participants. It does not provide funding for operating funds. SASi currently is providing approximately 2,100 meals a month, both in-house and through home-delivered meals to the entire Bonner County; respite services for seven families in the DayBreak Center and is a center for social, health and educational classes and events monthly.
