They will have it set up so that you can empty them into a disposal box or throw the container into a garbage bag. There is no charge for this. They are handling all aspects of this. break!" Well, she got one!! On her hike that first Saturday morning, she tripped on a rock and broke her leg!



Senior Spotlight – "Ove" Swede Gunnarson

This month we are featuring our friend, Ove "Swede" Gunnarson. He is our resident genuine Swedish participant. He said that when he came to the USA, so many years ago, they couldn't understand his Swedish accent, so, he's been called "Swede" for many years.

Ove and his family lived in rural Sweden where he attended school. At 13, he began an apprenticeship in furniture upholstery which in those days he earned 13 cents an hour. Doing this began his lifelong career in upholstering. In 1970, he and his wife Lil moved from Sweden to Illinois. He told me that in those days when you came here on a visa, you had to have a job secured and ready for you upon coming to the US. So they came to America and one time saw a TV show featuring the Northwest and its beauty. So they packed up and moved to Oregon. Over the next many years the family moved from Oregon to northern California, Colorado, Montana, Alaska, and Hawaii. They along with their 3 children, finally moved to Washington. Their daughter was living in Bonners Ferry where they landed and stayed. Swede said that "Bonners Ferry was the best place to

live and Hawaii for them was the worst." It was about 2 years ago, Swede came into SASi for the first time. This very tall, thin man strode in and began to have lunch here. He comes in most days to eat and can be the first one out of here. He jokes about how he doesn't get enough to eat so we load him up. Several years ago, Swede's wife Lil became ill and passed away. That's when we started seeing him come in daily. He once remarked, "If I didn't have

this place to come to, I don't know what I would do." Swede loves to garden and in season he brings in boxes of delicious fruits and vegetables and shares with all of his friends!!

Swede, we like having you here! And we love your vegies!

Mary's Munchies: Quick and Easy Swedish Teacakes

1cup butter, softened

1/2 cup confectioners' sugar

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

2 cups all-purpose flour

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 cup finely chopped pecans

Confectioners' sugar

1. Preheat oven to 325° F. Cream butter, sugar and vanilla in a large mixer bowl at medium speed. Beat in flour and salt at low speed until dough together. Stir in pecans.

- 2. Shape level tablespoons of dough into 1-inch balls. Place 1 inch apart onto ungreased cookie sheets.
- 3. Bake at 325°F for 15 to 20 minutes or until set but not browned. Remove cookies; cool slightly on racks. Roll balls in confectioners' sugar. Cool completely, then roll again in confectioners' sugar.
- 4. Store in a loosely covered container. Makes 3 dozen.

Please read this— a cautionary tale about fraud online!

Once in a while we hear about a scam that's going on. This time it happened to one of our SASi Board members, Dorothy Kohne. She wanted to let you know what transpired while on a Facebook posting. For those of us who like to use FB as a way to reconnect to people we knew and for other reasons, we don't like to think this goes on. However, it's important to remember this goes world wide and we don't always know who is also watching what we do. So with that in mind, let's listen to what occurred with Dorothy.

In January, 2018, Dorothy was on FB and mistakenly "friended" a person who began posting immediately using the name Mark Melvin. He said he was in the Navy on duty somewhere dangerous. He went on to say he was lonely and looking for somebody to chat with. As time went on he disclosed he had a daughter going to school in Ghana and that his wife had been killed in a car accident. Pretty soon Mark started becoming very "friendly" with Dorothy. She mentioned how other men online had also been asking for money due to tragic circumstances in their lives.

Dorothy didn't agree to help them. However, with Mark, he was persistent but patient. He told her he had a check for \$900,000 and it had to be sent to her through a Mr. Burns. She was asked to send \$1,200.00 via Western Union. Actually Dorothy was certain he would be asking for money as this is becoming a common type of scam. When she didn't do what he wanted, she began to get emails from Mr. Burns stating how they had to have this money. He sent at least 4 emails. Not taking no for an answer, he stated that Mark Melvin was seriously wounded and needed this money desperately! Shortly after that she went onto Mark's website only to find out he was already scamming other women. Dorothy emailed him asking why was he scamming other women so quickly? He began to chastise her and wondered why she wouldn't help him. Dorothy blocked him. Dorothy called the Veterans Association and told them about Mark. They told her that the VA doesn't send money. The moral of the story is Never send any of YOUR MONEY to strangers! If it's too good to be true, it probably is!!



We receive reimbursement monies from the Area Agency on Aging in Coeur d'Alene which receives funding from the Idaho Commission on Aging which is funded from the U.S. Government Older Americans Act. This funding covers approximately 1/3 of the costs of our meals programs and limited scholarships for DayBreak participants. It does not provide funding for operating funds. SASi currently is providing approximately 2,100 meals a month, both in-house and through home-delivered meals to the entire Bonner County; respite services for seven families in the DayBreak Center and is a center for social, health and educational classes and events monthly.
