We all know what a great town we have here! And I love how the folks who move here are always looking for a way to improve things! Two of those people who came to Sandpoint are Ron and Nanci Jenkins. They worked together (and later married) in Colorado when Nanci's daughter, four year old Jacey, had a life threatening disease. Their friends rallied around the family and founded Jacey's Race, a non-profit organization that helps kids with cancer or other life threatening illnesses. Jacey is now a senior at college and cancer free. After moving here 13 ½ years ago, she and her family decided to organize the race here after seeing a need and wanted to "pay it forward" to help other area kids. Health and started the Bonner County Coalition for Health which meets monthly at BGH. Through this group, we were able to get the garden boxes which are on the Senior Center south wall. Community gardens at the local elementary schools and the food bank have also "sprouted up" with funding from the BCCFH.

Now the group is taking on another community task. A community wide effort has started with the Bonner County EMTs to map all of the defibrillators in the area. We have one here at the Senior Center. In addition, Dr. Jenkins and Bob Abbott from the Bonner County EMS office have started a project to increase CPR training so that more people will know what to do in case of emergency. Seattle has one of the highest survival rate from heart attacks because there are so many people there who know CPR. We want to reach that per capita rate here as well! If you'd like to be trained in CPR, let us



know or call the county EMS office!

Need a summer reading list? Are you worried about memory loss or Alzheimer's? Are you willing to look outside the box for ideas? I personally believe there are triggers that begin a disease process. I am always on the lookout for what those might be and what might undo that first domino that falls, spiraling us into disease. And I personally believe that the body is made to be self-healing given the correct care. The hard part is figuring out what that is.

One way we can continue to help people who are dealing with dementia in some form is by constantly sharing ideas and information. In the last half of 2017, three books were published which give some hope to the idea that perhaps Alzheimer's disease can be prevented and even in some cases reversed. Wow, if true!! They are:

"The End of Alzheimer's" by Dale E. Bredesen, M.D., published 2017.

"The Alzheimer's Solution" by Dean and Ayesha Sherzai,

M.D., published 2017.

"Memory Rescue" by Daniel G. Amen M.D., published 2017.

An earlier book, "Stop Alzheimer's Now" by Bruce Fife, N.D. was published in 2011, and updated in 2016. And if you really want to go out on a limb, check out Anthony William's "Medical Medium", published 2015. These authors do not accept the belief currently held by the medical community that there is nothing you can do when faced with dementia.

I have not read all of these yet and I don't have any opinions or evidence one way or another. "Lifestyle Medicine" seem to be the operative phrase. How we handle our bodies and our minds may be important and many normal things we do or don't do day to day may take more of a toll than we realize. So check then out yourself if you are interested and let me know if you hear of any successes along these lines.



Mary's Munchies: Fresh Strawberry Upside Down Cake

Ingredients:

2 cups crushed fresh strawberries

1 (6 oz.) pkg. strawberry flavored Jell-o mix

3 cups mini marshmallows

1 (18 oz.) pkg. yellow cake mix, batter prepared as directed

Add all ingredients in list.

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350° degrees.
- 2. Spread crushed strawberries on bottom of a 9 x 13

inch baking pan. Evenly sprinkle strawberries with the gelatin powder, and top with mini marshmallows.

3. Prepare cake mix as directed, and pour on top of the marshmallows. Bake in the pre-heated oven until a toothpick stuck in center of cake comes out clean. Bake for 40-50 min. Cool cake in pan for 15 min. Run a knife around the edges to loosen the cake. Turn the cake out onto a serving tray. Store cake in the refrigerator. Serve with whipped topping!



This funding covers approximately 1/3 of the costs of our meals programs and limited scholarships for DayBreak participants. It does not provide funding for operating funds. SASi currently is providing approximately 2,100 meals a month, both in-house and through home-delivered meals to the entire Bonner County; respite services for seven families in the DayBreak Center and is a center for social, health and educational classes and events monthly.
