Ron was not just board president. He was a good friend. He was one of the kindest men I've ever known. For me personally, he was an advisor with a great sense of humor. He was always in a positive mood

and helped out whenever he could. He was a great listener and could see lots of sides to a situation.

I enjoyed watching Ron's friendship with Jackie blossom. He was fortunate to have two sweet loves in his life. If you are reading this and know Jackie, please give her a call or stop by to give her support.


As of this date, plans are in the works for a celebration of Ron's life on Saturday, December 1st. As the details get formalized, we will have information at the front desk.

Mary's Munchies: Easy Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Cookies

Ingredients:

1 box yellow cake mix

2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice

1 can pumpkin

1/2 cup butter, melted

3/4 cup mini chocolate chips

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Line baking sheets with parchment paper.
- 2. Sift together yellow cake mix and pumpkin pie spice. With an electric mixer, beat in pumpkin and

vegetable oil.

- 3. Gently fold in chocolate chips.
- 4. Drop by rounded tablespoons (using a cookie scoop, preferably) onto prepared baking sheets.
- 5. Bake in the preheated oven for 12 14 minutes, or until tops spring back when lightly pressed.
- 6. Cool on the baking sheets for several minutes before transferring to wire racks to cool completely.
- 7. Store in a airtight container for up to one week, or 3 months in the freezer.

Sandpoint Area Seniors, Inc. (SASi) is funded primarily through grants and *your donations*! We receive reimbursement monies from the Area Agency on Aging in Coeur d'Alene which receives funding from the Idaho Commission on Aging which is funded from the U.S. Government Older Americans Act. This funding covers approximately 1/3 of the costs of our meals programs and limited scholarships for DayBreak participants. It does not provide funding for operating funds. SASi currently is providing approximately 2,100 meals a month, both in-house and through home-delivered meals to the entire Bonner County; respite services for seven families in the DayBreak Center and is a center for social, health and educational classes and events monthly.
