Executive Director's Corner: Ellen Weissman

Season's Greetings! Wow, did this year go fast! Thank you for your patience as this newsletter is getting out a bit behind schedule! With the Thanksgiving holiday and a conference in Washington, DC, my timing was thrown off a bit.

The conference in Washington was on hunger and food insecurity. This is the time of year when we tend to think often about the needs of people less fortunate than ourselves and this was a theme that ran through my head daily during the meetings. The opening session featured a young woman who has gotten out of poverty and is now raising awareness about what she went through. She has a son who at age 2 would cry himself to sleep from hunger and would wake up with frozen eye boogers because their apartment had no heat. He was going blind and fortunately she was able to get help



before it became permanent. As I walked back to where I was staying one evening, I passed a homeless person sleeping on a bench covered with a tarp. Hearing about people doing this "in the big cities" and actually seeing it is quite different. And I know we have homeless folks here in Sandpoint because we were able to help one person get an apartment in the summer and we have had two lunch guests in the past couple months tell us similar stories.

So I am mentioning all this because your donations through out the year help not just the seniors who are regular attendees coming here for comradery, but also those who are on the edge financially and our meal might just be the only one they have that day.

While in DC, I was fortunate to meet with Senator Risch and aides from Rep. Labrador and Senator Crapo's offices and discuss the need for better funding for senior centers and food banks. What an empowering experience to meet with our legislators!



Mary's Munchies: Holiday Truffles

Ingredients: 3 cups semi-sweet chocolate chips, 1 can (14 oz.) sweetened condensed milk, 1 tbs. vanilla extract.

Directions:

- 1. In a microwave, combine chips and milk. Microwave on high for 3 minutes, stirring after 1-1/2 minutes, stir until smooth. Stir in vanilla. Chill for 3 hours or until firm.
- 2. Shape into 1 inch balls, roll in nuts, coconut, cocoa or sprinkles. Chill 1 hour or until firm. Store covered at room temperature.

Makes 4 dozen.

Decorate each ball with finely chopped nuts, flaked coconut, baking cocoa, or red or green sprinkles.



We receive reimbursement monies from the Area Agency on Aging in Coeur d'Alene which receives funding from the Idaho Commission on Aging which is funded from the U.S. Government Older Americans Act. This funding covers approximately 1/3 of the costs of our meals programs and limited scholarships for DayBreak participants. It does not provide funding for operating funds. SASi currently is providing approximately 2,100 meals a month, both in-house and through home-delivered meals to the entire Bonner County; respite services for seven families in the DayBreak Center and is a center for social, health and educational classes and events monthly.
