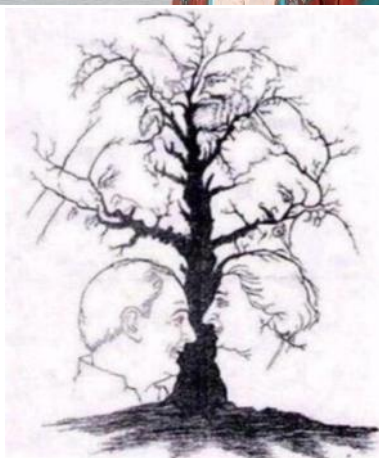

Senior Spotlight: Jean Deremer

For the month of May, we are featuring Jean Deremer. Jean was born on March 5, 1947, in Czechoslovakia. She was an only child living with her mother and grandmother. Jean lived there until she was 21 when she left in 1968 after the Russian invasion. During that time she went to Yugoslavia through Italy and spent some time in a refugee camp. She emigrated to the US through New York, where she met a friend who was also a scuba diver. They left NY and went to Long Beach, CA. and then to Palm Springs, California where she worked washing cars, dog grooming, cocktail waitress, and bartended for 2 years. She felt it was very important to learn English, so she went to work for a family where she needed to speak only English. In 1972, Jean met her then husband who was getting out of the Navy during the Vietnam War.



They headed to Colorado where their car broke down and were stuck in Las Vegas, where she ended up living and working for the next 29 years. Jean ended up working for different casinos until she was laid off. She retired and ended up coming to Sandpoint in 2013. Jean worked at Schweitzer bartending and working in a little store there. Jean is presently unemployed and has been volunteering at SASi recently.

Mary's Munchies: Crêpes with Strawberries

Ingredients:

1/2 cup all-purpose flour, 1/2 t salt, 3/4 cup skim milk, 1 large egg, Vegetable oil, 1 cup, 1 cup plain low-fat yogurt, 2 T honey, 1 T Muscat dessert wine, 1/4 t grated orange zest, 24 strawberries, sliced, Confectioner's sugar, for dusting.

Step 1: In a small bowl, whisk the flour with the salt. Add the milk, egg and 1 tablespoon of oil and whisk until smooth. Cover and let rest for 20 minutes. In another small bowl, whisk the yogurt, honey, Muscat and zest.

Step 2: Preheat the oven to 350°. Heat an 8-inch nonstick skillet. Rub the pan with an oiled paper towel. Add about 3 tablespoons of the crêpe batter, swirling the pan to coat evenly; pour off

any excess. Cook the crêpe over moderate heat until the bottom is brown in spots and the sides are crisp, about 2 minutes. Flip the crêpe and cook for 1 minute longer. Transfer to a baking sheet; repeat to make 7 more crêpes.

Step 3: Fold the crêpes into quarters and bake until hot, 4 minutes. Place 2 crêpes on each plate. Top with the yogurt sauce and garnish with the strawberries. Dust with confectioners' sugar and serve immediately.

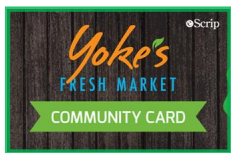

## ALERT

### GENETIC TESTING SCAM

Various companies are showing up at senior centers, health fairs, and similar places offering genetic testing or cancer screening, falsely claiming that Medicare will pay for it.

Follow these procedures:

- Do NOT give out your Medicare number or Social Security number at these kinds of events
- Do NOT consent to any lab tests at senior centers, health fairs, or in your home
- Genetic tests and cancer screenings must be medically necessary and ordered by YOUR doctor
- Monitor your Medicare Summary Notices for any services that you did not agree to
- If you think you may be the victim of Medicare fraud, call the Senior Medicare Patrol at 800-786-5536 ext 232.
- Help protect yourself and others. Spread the word!



Attention! The following is from Joe Lykins, Senior Medicare Patrol at the Area Agency on Aging in CdA. If you have any questions, call Joe at 208.667.3179, ext.222.

*Scammers throughout the country are offering genetic testing and cancer screenings and falsely claiming that Medicare will pay for them. Senior centers seem to have been especially targeted. If you or anyone you know is approached by these persons, you should not allow them access.*

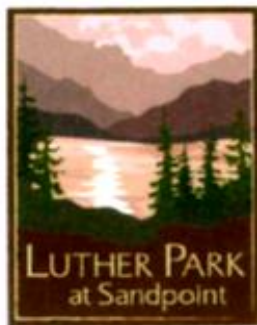
