








We Ready?



Fit 'n Fall Proof Class

Have you noticed our advertising for the Fit & Fall Proof exercise classes offered at the Sandpoint Senior Center? Have you been wondering what they are all about?

Fit & Fall Proof was developed right here in Idaho back in 2004, and is an exercise-based fall prevention program for older adults. We focus on improving balance, strength and mobility, and our aim is reduce the risk of falling in seniors. The program is funded by the Idaho Department of Health, and here in the Panhandle it is administered by Panhandle Health District.







Instructors are certified and retrained annually to reflect the improvements identified by the Idaho Department of Health, and to ensure the program is being followed correctly. All instructors are volunteers, giving their time and enthusiasm free to all senior Idahoans. And of course, the classes are offered free too!

We try to accommodate all ability levels, and exercises are modified to fit those who (for example) cannot stand for long. Each class is usually 50 to 55 minutes long, and we use music from the 30s, 40s, 50s and 60s to add to the fun.

Classes are held at the Sandpoint Senior Center on Mondays and Thursdays, at 3 pm. Wear loose clothing and non-slip shoes, bring a bottle of water and come give it a try! We look forward to seeing you here.


Kitchen Corner

Hello SASI!...We are all so excited about our new kitchen dishwasher that we are all doing a happy dance!! Thank you SASI for your patience and cooperation for eating on paper plates and bearing with us! This month we are doing STRAWBERRIES: Strawberries belong to the rose family and they are the only fruit that has seeds on the outside.

Strawberries are super delicious and super good for you, too! They are packed with vitamins and minerals, including vitamin C, folate, & potassium. That said strawberries boosts immune system and can lower blood pressure. Strawberries are known to protect your heart, and lower your cholesterol and blood sugar levels. Some say that they can fight some forms of cancer. Strawberry Tip: When possible, visit your local Farmers Market for fresh, local produce. Let us know how you would like strawberries prepared by slipping a note in the comment jars located on the dining room tables.

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
