50 YEARS OF SERVING BONNER COUNTY SENIORS!

How did this start?

Alamae and Lloyd Cox moved to Sandpoint from El Cajon, California, where they participated in an active senior center. Alamae missed the senior center so much that she decided to start one here. Thanks to the efforts of the Cox's, SASi was officially incorporated in January 21, 1974 under the name of Bonner County Senior Citizens Council, Inc. The Bonner County Senior Citizens Council, Inc. officially became Sandpoint Area Seniors, Inc. on January 7, 1988 and are still here today!







When SASi began, meals for seniors were prepared by local restaurants and served on site. Like today, the Center was affiliated with the Area Agency on Aging, and the amount each participant paid was a donation, not a required amount. The Center provided a place to meet for meals, activities, dances, entertainment and games. Looking back at old pictures, the Center was often packed with people seated at long tables!



Sometime after 1985, the Senior Center opened it's own commercial kitchen. To this day, our staff prepares nutritious meals that are delivered to homebound seniors and served on site five days a week. In any given month, over 2000 meals are delivered to seniors throughout Bonner County by our volunteer drivers.
